Great Opportunity to Connect Homebuyers with the Fulton Affordable Housing Program

any of you may remember the January FNN article about Laura Martinez, her two children, and Tilly the cat, who moved into a home in Fulton with the help of funding from the Fulton Neighborhood Association and the City of Lakes Community Land Trust (CLCLT).

\$100,000 is still available from the FNA to provide \$50,000 each to two more home buyers. Added to this is up to \$60,000 from CLCLT for each of the two homes, making a total of up to \$110,000 in cash to buy down the mortgages of the prospective Fulton homeowners. CLCLT also provides up to \$25,000 to make repairs to the new home after doing a detailed analysis of needed improvements.

To qualify, the potential buyer must not earn more than 50 percent of the area median income, which is currently \$42,000 for a family of four. So, if you know of or hear about anyone who would like to live in Fulton, and who you think might qualify, have them call Jeff Washburne at CLCLT at 612-721-7556, ext. 17.

Mulch: The Good and the Bad

Choose Your Mulch with Care

o help retain moisture, it's good to replenish that layer of mulch around your trees, but did you know that some wood mulch may have been treated with *chromated copper arsenate* (CCA), a chemical used to retard wood rot and found to be a carcinogen? Despite the fact that this chemical was banned in 2004, some salvaged wood used to manufacture garden mulch may contain this dangerous chemical. Toxic dyes that are unsafe for you and your pets are also sometimes used to color mulch. Cocoa bean mulch is not recommended due to a possible risk of poisoning for dogs. Although cypress mulch is generally free of additives, much of it on the market was not sustainably harvested and could come from deforested Florida or Louisiana wetlands. Emerald ash borers could be hitching a ride in mulch from an infected area if the woodchips are larger than an inch in diameter.

Bottom line – ask before you purchase. A safe alternative is the free woodchip pile at Armatage Park, 5700 block of Russell Ave. S.

Pershing Park Improvements

Soccer Field Irrigation and Energy Efficiency Updates

Improvements to the Pershing soccer fields are slated to begin in July 2011. The project will entail: soil preparation, grading, installation of irrigation, a removal of Field #3 (to make space for an additional soccer field) and seeding. The grant is through the Hennepin County Youth Sports Program with financial support from the Fulton Neighborhood Association, Linden Hills Neighborhood Council and Southwest Activities Council.

Pershing was also one of five parks selected to participate in the McKinstry Energy Efficiency Project. The program will implement energy-saving measures based upon the unique needs of each recreation center. Improvements will begin in August and be completed by the end of 2010. The work focuses on heating and air conditioning systems, web-based temperature controls, energy efficient lighting, weatherstripping, insulation, vending machine operation controls and plumbing enhancements to conserve water. Project work will not impact the day-to-day operations at the recreation centers.
