Update on Proposed Flight Path Changes at MSP Airport

On Jan. 9, Fulton Neighborhood Association hosted a community

meeting with special guests Councilmembers John Quincy (Ward 11) and Betsy Hodges (Ward 13). The Council Members provided an overview and update on the proposed changes to flight paths at MSP airport. The FAA wants to change the rules by which planes take-off. They would like to



implement Performance Based Navigation (PBN) and developed Radar Navigation (RNAV) paths that concentrate flight takeoffs into narrow paths. The City felt that there was not sufficient community engagement or environmental study on this issue and asked the FAA to slow down the process. In an unprecedented move, the Metropolitan Airports Commission (MAC) supported the City in its request and approved a partial implementation of the proposed routes over the southern metro area, but not for those routes going over south and southwest Minneapolis.

Many thanks go out to MAC Chair Dan Boivin, Gov. Dayton, Sens. Franken and Klobuchar, Rep. Keith Ellison, State Sen. Dibble and State Rep. Hornstein (Chairs of Senate and House Transportation Committees, respectively) for their help.

On Feb 1, MAC Executive Director Jeff Hamiel sent a letter to the FAA suggesting that implementation of RNAV over south and southwest Minneapolis be delayed until RNAV over the southern metro area has already been implemented and evaluated. He recommends that the FAA wait until July 2015 to begin the process of re-engaging with the communities to evaluate how RNAV can be implemented over Minneapolis.

A group of residents from neighborhoods affected by proposed RNAV tracks over Minneapolis and Edina has formed a coalition to help keep neighborhoods engaged and informed on airport related issues. They will also be considering how the MSP Airport 2020 Expansion Plan could affect Fulton residents in the near future and will request that a proper environmental impact study is done. Turn on the Lights Project

Southwest High School has recently launched the Turn on the Lights Project. This project calls for the installation of permanent lighting to the Southwest High School stadium to allow for nighttime track meets and soccer and football games. The stadium will be renamed after two of Southwest's legendary coaches, Art Frederickson and Dave Peterson.

Studies show that lighted fields help in multiple ways to build and support local neighborhoods and communities. The stadium is shared with Pershing Park, so community events such as Special Olympics, SWAC and Armatage track will also benefit.

The Turn on the Lights Project was the idea of Harvey Feldman, a1961 alumni of Southwest High School. Mr. Feldman was inspired after attending the homecoming game in 2011 with rented lights. The project is being managed by the Southwest Foundation with the full support of Southwest High School and in coordination with the Minneapolis Public Schools. Anderson-Johnson Associates, Inc., a local firm with experience in other city stadium projects, has been hired to install the lights. They have recently completed the necessary soil borings and are just at the very beginning of the design process. The design process will include neighborhood input to address concerns about light "spill" and glare. The Turn on the Lights Committee is dedicated to addressing neighbor issues including waste, noise, parking, crowd control, neighborhood use and other issues that may arise.

Installation of the lights will cost \$300,000. This includes all the design, permitting, and installation. There is no funding for the project from the district budget; private fundraising is underway. Mr. Feldman has offered to match the first \$300,000 raised, dollar-for-dollar, for long-range enhancements such as an updated concession stand, a new scoreboard, an improved entrance and artificial turf. The budget for the long-range enhancements has not yet been determined and will depend, in part, on how much money is raised. Mr. Feldman remembers playing at Parade Stadium and says "I want those kids to have that same feeling I had – playing under the lights with the community there to support them."
