Fulton artist Gail Katz-James, who works primarily with found objects to create wall sculptures and public collaborative art, is coming to the Fulton Farmers Market this spring. Gail is best known in Fulton for the popular Fulton Favorites vard signs created by children and adults a few years ago. Once again, she will work with families at free art workshops, held during the Fulton Farmers Markets on Saturdays, to create colorful lawn signs preprinted with the Farmers Market logo, hours and location. The EcoBLEND Award encourages and rewards eco-friendly design and sustainable building practices in both new and remodeled projects in Minneapolis. The award will evaluate nominees in four areas including resource efficiency, water conservation, indoor environmental quality, and energy efficiency.

Projects that are eligible for the BLEND and EcoBLEND Awards include new construction, additions, and remodeled projects within the city of Minneapolis that have been completed since July 1, 2007. Both residential and commercial projects are eligible. Submitted projects are due July 31 and the annual awards ceremony will be held September 18.

The BLEND Award has its roots in neighborhoods but over its seven years has expanded citywide. The EcoBLEND Award has been incorporated, and the project now includes corporate sponsors who will allow the awards to further advocate our mission and recognize selected projects. Sponsors include Marvin Windows, Grazzini Brothers & Company, Varsity Painters and Southview Design.



Update on Proposed Flight Path Changes

The proposed changes to flight paths at MSP Airport continue to be a topic of concern to Fulton residents. MSP FairSkies Coalition, a group of representatives from southwest neighborhoods and Edina, is closely

monitoring the situation.

The map to the right shows the proposed effect to Fulton neighborhood. The new RNAV flight path would carry 23%, or 135 daily flights, of all departures from runway 30 over Fulton neighborhood. Currently in Fulton we hear take-offs and arrivals not only from the planes that are flying directly over the neighborhood, but also from planes that are flying over Highway 62 ten blocks away. If the proposed changes go through, we will hear all of this plus all the planes that currently fly over Richfield, as they will all be shifted up to the Highway 62 corridor.



What can residents do? Continue contacting your federal and local elected representatives and tell them that the proposed plan is unacceptable. Contact information for your representatives is on the FairSkies website: www.mspfairskies.org. Furthermore, keep this issue in front of Mayoral and City Council candidates — let them know that you expect proactive responses from your elected representatives. There is also a new online petition that can be reviewed and signed at: http://www.mspfairskies.org/make-yourvoice-heard. A direct link to this petition can be found on the FNA website.

Residents could also file noise complaints on the Metropolitan Airports Commission website: http://www.macnoise.com/our-neighbors/file-noise-complaint. Although it might seem futile, it is really the only way to formally and officially complain. There is no limit to how many times you can complain; some residents have actually put it on their phones as a home page and submit complaints back to back as they hear the planes. This information does become part of public record and we and others can use the data in our fight.
