Update on Proposed Flight Path Changes

MSP FairSkies, a coalition of neighborhood representatives from several southwest Minneapolis neighborhoods and Edina, continue to monitor the proposed changes to flight paths at MSP Airport. They recently met with Metropolitan Airports Commission (MAC) staff and requested more detailed data on existing flight paths. Many southwest Minneapolis residents have noticed a rise in airport noise over the past few years; MSP Fair Skies and MAC are trying to understand why that is happening now, even before any proposed changes.



Another concern is the projected 20 percent growth in air traffic. The MAC has provided no specific details on how this increase in air traffic will be dispersed over the metro area. For instance, would some runways have a larger percentage increase than others, and how would this growth be distributed among proposed RNAV tracks, if implemented? MSP FairSkies advocates for a plan that includes expansion of alternative airports and regional rail to alleviate the pressure on MSP, as well as to spur economic development of greater Minnesota.

What can individual residents do? Visit MSPFairSkies.org to sign the online petition. Like them on Facebook and check out the new video on their website about the methods of noise measurement currently in use at MSP airport. You can also keep this issue front and center with Mayoral and City Council candidates during this election
