# Minnehaha Creek Neighborhood Community Meeting Notes

# Saturday March 22, 2014 9:30 a.m.-11:00 a.m. Lynnhurst Community Center

## **First Breakout - Overview Discussion**

### General

- Start with preservation of the environment and then consider small things
- Keep it natural (unique environment) but with safe paths

#### Access

- Better access at Penn-improved access up and down the hills (e.g. timbers)
- Safety issue for sharing walking and biking
  - No biking certain areas
  - Bikes could utilize roads next to creek
  - Bike path opposite side from natural path
  - Bike path connection at 54th
- Safe crossings at Xerxes and Penn
  - Crosswalks
  - o Stairs
  - o Tunnels under roads
- Paths
  - Need safe walking surface
  - Strongly in favor of sustainable, natural trails
- Steps at Washburn spillway
- Access to Edina park

#### Amenities

- Trash Cans and benches desired
  - Call 311 for removal of waste
  - o Bench at top of Newton hill
- Restroom by tennis courts
- Drinking fountains
- Dog Bag Stations
- Signage
  - o Environmental
  - History of the creek

#### **Environmental Improvements**

- Remove spillways and replace with safer alternative
  - Walkway over top
  - o Stairs
- Erosion concerns
  - Forest management more trees
  - o Native plantings
- Runoff/Flood Control
  - o From alleys
  - From spillways
- Walkways/Paths permeable only
- General maintenance improved
- Steps/terraced rain gardens
- Keep it as natural as possible
- Garbage removal

## Second Breakout – Site Specific Discussion

#### Zenith to Upton

- This section is the most neglected section of the creek
- It has two major spillways that should be converted into better runoff filtering
  - Consider terraced rain gardens
- Lots of erosion that needs to be shored up
- ¾ in the group liked the idea of a pedestrian bridge from 54<sup>th</sup> St to the Hill below Zenith Ave
  - Gives bike access from the Edina bike route to the 54<sup>th</sup> St. bike route east of Xerxes
  - Wanted a "natural" bridge like the wood bridges close to Lynnhurst
  - This would reduce pedestrian traffic from the north side of the creek and make for easier walking.
- Safety is an issue for those walking across Xerxes
  - Traffic is heavy on Xerxes and there are lots of turning cars to and from 54<sup>th</sup> St.
  - All would like to see a flashing cross-walk activated by buttons on each side of the creek

### Upton to Penn

- Keep it natural
  - o Timbers
  - o Rain Gardens
- Buckthorn removal/maintenance
- Penn Ave access
- Xerxes Ave access
- Flooding on Forest Dale

#### Penn to Logan

- Leave as wild and natural as possible
- Consider extending a buffer of native plantings
  - up from the creek towards Penn field
  - Rain gardens along edge of creek (water quality)
  - o will require proper establishment and maintenance to prevent weeds
- Balance use/play areas with native plant establishment
  - Kids and families use this area extensively
- Benches at top of Newton hill
- Bathroom near tennis courts
- Maintain wooded area by Newton sledding hill
- Protect oak trees near Penn field
- Better trail maintenance and safety
- Safer Penn Ave. crossing
  - o Pavement markings
  - o Signage
  - Curb adjustment to shorten crossing
- Respect nearby property owners
- Improve pedestrian ramp/curbing at 52<sup>nd</sup> and Morgan
- All improvements must be maintainable with operating funds for long-term maintenance
  - o MPRB tried native plantings once before but it failed
  - o MPRB also stopped mowing turf grass once and this was viewed negatively

#### Logan to Community Center

- Walk and bike path at less natural area
- Porta-potty at Logan tennis courts
- Rainwater catchments at alleys south of creek
  - Minimize run-off to creek
  - Rain gardens
