# **Test your Home for Radon**

Have you wondered if radon is a problem in your home or wanted to get more information on radon? Radon is a colorless, odorless radioactive gas that is found in nearly all soils. Levels in outdoor air are usually much lower than indoor air.



Houses draw up air from the soil and that allows radon gas to enter the home. The soil around your home is porous and the radon gas is able to move through the dirt and rocks into the basement through pathways, like cracks in the concrete slab, and accumulate in the house.

Studies have shown that radon is a health concern. Over time, breathing in radon gas and its radioactive particles can increase your risk of lung cancer by causing damage to the cells that line the lung; long-term exposure to radon can then lead to lung cancer. In the U.S., radon exposure is associated with 21,000 lung cancer deaths a year and is the second-leading cause of lung cancer. This risk increases for those who smoke.

The Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) has data from approximately 1,250 radon home tests from the Fulton neighborhood. The results show that 33.54% of those homes had elevated radon levels at or above 4.0 picocuries (pCi/L). This is similar to levels found across the state. The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) recommends taking action to reduce radon in homes that have a radon level at or above 4 pCi/L.



### **MSP FairSkies Airport Update**

**Arrivals**: The FAA has decided to implement Required Navigation (RNAV) at Minneapolis-St. Paul International Airport for arrivals only, while RNAV departures were "postponed for further study and community input."

What does this mean for residents?

- The implementation date for RNAV arrivals is not yet known by the Metropolitan Airports Commission (MAC) staff, but likely the end of this year.
- It appears that RNAV arrivals tracks will result in little or no change from current arrivals, since RNAV arrival tracks are essentially the same as the current flight paths.
- There is ongoing concern that the often-cited benefit of RNAV arrivals —noise reduction due to a straight descent vs. multiple-tiered step-down descent —will bring relief only to communities farther away from the airport and not necessarily affect those closer to the airport, including Minneapolis residents. There is also concern about the distance between arriving planes (nose to tail). Some airports have found that RNAV technology allows for closer distances between planes, which will increase the frequency and noise of these arrival tracks.

**Remote Monitoring Towers (RMTs):** The MAC has 39 RMTs throughout the metro area to measure noise. Only four of these towers are west of 35W. Communities in Edina, St. Louis Park, and Minneapolis' ECCO neighborhood have asked for more RMTs so that we can use accurate data to better understand and compare noise impact on various communities.

It is very difficult to tell which homes will have a high radon level. Homes that are next door to each other can have different indoor radon levels, making a neighbor's test result a poor predictor of radon risk. Testing is the only way to know if your home has elevated radon levels. There are generally two tests that are used to detect radon: a short-term test and a long-term test. MDH recommends conducting a short-term test first. This is usually completed in only 3 to 7 days. If your short-term test result is greater than 8 pCi/L, MDH recommends conducting another short-term test. If your short-term test result is between 2 and 8 pCi/L, MDH recommends conducting a long-term test (test kits can be found through the MDH website). If the second test result, for either of those tests, is above 4.0 pCi/L, then you should take action to reduce your household radon levels; mitigation should be considered for homes with levels between 2 to 4 pCi/L.

If your home's radon level is at or above 4.0 pCi/L then you should hire a certified radon mitigator to install a system to

reduce radon concentrations (a list of certified mitigators is available on the MDH website). The goal of a radon mitigation system is to reduce the indoor radon levels to below the EPA action level of 4.0 pCi/L, but many systems reduce concentrations below 2.0 pCi/L. In general, costs can range from approximately \$800-\$2,500, with the average reduction system costing \$1,500. After a mitigation system is put in, the home should be re-tested to verify radon reduction.
