Draft Minneapolis 2040 Comprehensive Plan

The City of Minneapolis has recently released the Minneapolis 2040 Draft Comprehensive Plan (minneapolis2040.com). According to the city's website, "Minneapolis is growing, and will continue to grow. Done right, this new growth can help our city become a healthy, sustainable, and thriving place for all. Minneapolis 2040 is a draft Comprehensive Plan that shapes how the city will grow and change."

The plan strives to meet the goals set by the City Council; these goals are the compilation of themes that emerged over a two-year process of community engagement and are categorized by people, places and systems. Some of the goals include reducing economic, housing, safety, and health disparities among people of color; increase residents and jobs; increase affordable and quality housing; reflect the city's rich history and culture; access for all to employment, services, parks, etc.; be resilient to climate change and reduce greenhouse gas emissions; and remain the economic center of the region.

The plan is broken down into 11 topics; each topic contains policies that relate to the built, natural, and economic environment of the city. These policies are: Land Use and Built Form, Transportation, Housing, Economic Competitiveness, Environmental Systems, Public Health, Heritage Preservation, Arts and Culture, Parks and Open Spaces, Public Services and Facilities, and Technology and Innovations.





2018 Fulton Farmers Market Opens May 19

The Fulton Farmers Market, located in the parking lot of Lake Harriet United Methodist Church near 49th & Chowen, re-opens for the season on May 19 and will run every Saturday from 8:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. through Oct. 27. Make it part of your weekly Saturday morning routine to shop for locally grown and produced foods while connecting with your neighborhood community! We've had a chilly spring, but vegetables will be arriving at the market little by little with increasing variety over time. Look for greens, rhubarb and radishes opening weekend, soon to be followed by favorites like asparagus, strawberries, raspberries, tomatoes and much more.



We are excited to welcome several new farms and businesses to the market this season in addition to the many tried and true farms who will be returning. The new farms are Johnson Family Pastures (pasture raised chicken, pork, beef and eggs), Dancing the Land Farm (unusual vegetables) and Jen's Jars (condiments, sauces, and soups). Each Saturday the market will host activities and live music. Many Fulton residents have been discussing proposed changes to zoning that will increase the supply of housing and its diversity of location and types. Specifically, the plan states as an action that "In neighborhood interiors farthest from downtown that today contain primarily single-family homes, achieve greater housing supply and diversity by allowing small-scale residential structures on traditional size city lots with up to four dwelling units, including single family, duplex, three-unit, four-unit, and accessory dwelling unit building types." The majority of Fulton is categorized for this type of development. The parts of Fulton along transit routes (Penn, Xerxes, France and 50th St.)



are categorized for higher-density residential buildings up to four stories tall, with proposed taller structures evaluated on a case-by-case basis. The properties that are adjacent to a transit route (next to, around the corner, behind, etc.) serve as a transition to lower density residential areas and could allow for the combining of parcels for multifamily buildings up to three stories.

The neighborhood association will continue to track the draft plan and provide feedback to the city on it based on what we hear from the neighborhood. We encourage you to read through the plan online (minneapolis2040.org) and make comment. You can jump from topic to topic and provide your feedback right on your screen through interactive comment boxes. You can also provide written comment by e-mail to 2040@minneapolismn.gov or attend one of the public meetings (see sidebar on p. 1).

Minneapolis Parks News

Southwest Area Parks and Minnehaha Creek Improvement Master Plans

The Minneapolis Park and Recreation Board is launching two new master planning projects which will impact Fulton neighborhood.

Minnehaha Parkway Regional Trail Master Plan

Parkland along both sides Minnehaha Creek between Minnehaha Regional Park and the western city limit.

Southwest Service Area Master Plan

All Minneapolis neighborhood parks south of I-394 and west of I-35W, including small triangle park properties; does not include regional parks.

A Community Advisory Council (CAC) has been formed for each of these projects and Fulton neighborhood will have representation and input on both councils. We will keep the neighborhood updated via the newsletter, enews, social media and fultonneighborhood.org and will ask for feedback on the emerging plans.

Minnehaha Parkway Lighting Improvements

Parkway lighting replacement continues this spring around Lake Harriet

City of Minneapolis crews will mobilize this spring to complete the parkway lighting replacement around Lake Harriet Parkway. This work is a collaboration between the Minneapolis Park and Recreation Board and the City of Minneapolis.

Parkway lights will be relocated from the lake side of the parkway to the boulevard opposite the lake in two locations on the south and northeast portions of the lake.

The relocated lights will help preserve mature vegetation by moving equipment access away from the lake and provide even lighting distribution for the parkway and adjacent sidewalk. Adjacent trail lighting will not be impacted.

At the end of this round of lighting replacements, all parkway lights on Lake Harriet Parkway will have been replaced.
