MSP FairSkies Responds to the Draft Minneapolis 2040 Comprehensive Plan

MSP FairSkies was formed by Twin Cities residents in 2012 with the belief that greater transparency and accountability of the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and Metropolitan Airports Commission (MAC) to the community is the path to fair airport solutions in Minnesota. Our activities in the past year have been toward seeking more transparency and accountability from the MAC and the Noise Oversight Committee (NOC).

MSP FairSkies has been monitoring and commenting on the draft Minneapolis 2040 Comprehensive Plan. We believe that noise pollution from MSP airport is inadequately addressed in the plan. MSP Airport is considered within some of the economic focused policies in the draft plan, but we believe that it is not just an economic issue. Airport noise has a large health impact on our city and should be also considered within some of the public health policies.

Under either the economic or public health policies, we need clear action steps that lead to noise reduction at the source for our communities:

- * Measurement and publication of noise contours and number of people impacted maps at 55dB DNL, the international standard
- * Noise reduction goals—50 percent reduction by 2025
- * Citizen representatives from Minneapolis on the NOC

We urge all of you to consider the impacts of MSP Airport as you review the draft plan. Please comment as many voices united will have more of an impact. You can comment directly on the interactive plan on the website (minneapolis2040.com), on the comment form (using "How to Comment" on the website) or by sending an e-mail: 2040@minneapolismn.gov. **Comments are due by July 22.**

Q. What can I do, at home, to help the environment?

The Fulton Neighborhood Association Environmental Committee recommends practicing organic lawn and garden methods. Use organic fertilizer, plant pollinator-friendly and native plants in your garden and commit to stop using pesticides and herbicides. Keep your street storm drains clear of debris that can harm our lakes, streams and wildlife.

Properly dispose of your household hazardous waste (HHW) such as cleaning products, chemicals, motor oil, rags and paints properly. Do not pour them down the drain or put them in the trash. 
Fulton Neighborhood Survey Results Snapshot

FNA received nearly 350 responses. The full survey results can be found on FNA's website (fultonneighborhood.org), but a few fun results are below.


