Residential Security Rebates Still Available



Fulton Neighborhood Association (FNA) has recently launched a rebate program for all Fulton residents (owner or renter) to encourage new residential security upgrades to their home. FNA will reimburse up to \$100 (per address, per calendar year) for upgrades such as exterior lighting, motion detector lighting, video doorbells, exterior cameras, deadbolt locks, etc., as long as funds are available. Who's in the 'Hood: Fulton's Musical Family By Carolina Li

Who's in the 'Hood is a new feature highlighting the unique people and places of Fulton neighborhood.



There is something about Fulton that magically draws people from all over the world and leads them to call it home. Like any place, some of Fulton's charms are geographical: its parks, creeks, and lakes. But at the core of Fulton's appeal are its people and culture. After all, the fabric of a community is as central to the character of a place as is its geography. It is the beautiful people of Fulton that make the neighborhood a pleasant, happier place to live. And if you happen to walk down tree-lined Drew Ave., you might see this for yourself, as you hear in the distance the sweet melody of a violin. Follow the sound and it would guide you to Richard and Cece's home, two of Minnesota's most celebrated professional musicians, raising their musical family of four right here in Fulton.

A native of St. Louis, Cece found her passion for music at age three. Her parents, both musicians, took Cece to music lessons and she discovered an affinity for the violin right away. As she describes it, "Doors kept opening to opportunities to keep learning and developing as a violinist through high school, college, and beyond." She studied at the University of Michigan, the Cleveland Institute of Music, and at Rice University. She was a fellow at the New World Symphony in

Miami Beach and also performed with the St. Louis, Pittsburgh and Houston Symphony Orchestras before joining the Minnesota Orchestra.

When Cece was studying for her Master's degree at Rice, she met her now-husband Richard Belcher. A native of Christchurch, New Zealand, Richard was exposed to a huge amount of music starting at six years, first on the piano, then singing in cathedral choir, and finally discovering that the cello was his instrument at age eleven. While studying music in New Zealand, he also played in the Christchurch Symphony Orchestra, and then moved to the United States to earn a Master's in cello at Yale University. While there, he founded the Ensō String Quartet which went on to receive multiple accolades, including a Grammy award nomination. All the while, Cece and Richard kept up their relationship, as they each followed music from one city to another.

It was Minnesota that brought the couple together. When Cece won a position with the Minnesota Orchestra in 2014, Richard was still active touring with the Ensō String Quartet based out of New York. Then, this past July, Richard won a position with the St. Paul Chamber Orchestra, which cemented their family base in Minnesota, encouraging them to put down roots in the Land of 10,000 Lakes. This allowed them to be in the same state for the first time in years. "It was a life-changer," Cece explains. "Life as a musician can sometimes mean not choosing where to live, so to suddenly have two opportunities in the same place was amazing and a miracle of timing." When not playing the great classics, Richard and Cece can be found singing and playing lullabies on the piano for their young children at home: a wonderfully happy boy named Finn, and their sweet, newborn daughter Annabel.

Fulton must have some magic of its own if, after travelling and touring all over the world, the Belchers chose to call it home. "We feel so lucky to be here," Richard affirms. And Fulton is lucky too, for if a neighborhood's character is marked by its people, then how lucky to have the Belchers amongst us, weaving a bridge of song and sound and bringing neighbors together in the symphony of life.
