2020-2021 Fulton Neighborhood Association Distance Learning Rebate Program Guidelines Updated 12.1.2020

Program Focus

The focus of the rebate program is to provide a rebate to Fulton residents incurring out of pocket costs for NEW educational expenses associated with distance learning during COVID-19 that were not necessary before the pandemic.

Rebates are available up to \$250.

Who is Eligible?

 All households in Fulton neighborhood with children attending K-12 public school in a distance learning or hybrid model qualify to receive a rebate. Multiple applications may be submitted, but the total of rebates for any household is limited to \$250, one rebate per household.

What can be funded?

- **NEW** educational costs for the 2020-2021 school year associated with distance learning during COVID-19 that were not necessary before the pandemic:
 - Computer hardware/accessories
 - Software
 - Supervision/focus of learning time
 - Commercial space rental
 - Newly installed internet access, hot spot or access point
 - o Furniture: Desk/chair

What is NOT funded?

- Food/beverages
- Entertainment
- Capital improvements, construction or renovation costs, purchase of property
- Equipment (other than noted above)
- Furniture (other than noted above)
- Childcare
- Space rental within a home
- Ongoing monthly utility costs (e.g. internet)
- Previously purchased computer hardware or software
- General supplies, books, etc. that would have been needed regardless of the pandemic

What is expected of rebate submission?

- Complete application available on the FNA website by January 31, 2021
- Provide receipts of new eligible expenses dated September 1, 2020 or after
