LUNAR NEW YEAR FULTON CELEBRATES THE YEAR OF THE SNAKE







This year, the Fulton Neighborhood Association together with Pershing Park staff hosted its first-ever Lunar New Year celebration on February 1, 2025 welcoming the Year of the Snake and embracing the holiday's central theme of "togetherness."

Lunar New Year is a spring festival whose origins date back thousands of years. The holiday marks the beginning of the new year, following the lunar calendar, typically lasting for two weeks; this year it started on January 29th and culminated on February 12th. Many communities across the world celebrate the Lunar New Year, particularly in East and Southeast Asia and by diaspora communities worldwide, including in the U.S., Canada, Australia, and Europe, where festivals and family gatherings honor traditional customs. Minneapolis is home to a diverse array of Asian communities including Chinese, Taiwanese, Hmong, Korean, Malaysian and many others, and Fulton is no exception.

On the day of Fulton's Lunar New Year celebration, under the hands of energetic volunteers, the main room in Pershing Park's fieldhouse quickly underwent a transformation: paper dragons adorned the entrance, tables were covered with red tablecloths, music, and a large backdrop featuring a pagoda helped set the stage for a vibrant festival space.

If one hadn't been fully awake and properly caffeinated on that early Saturday morning, one might have been tempted to say we had been transported from our familiar neighborhood park to a Chinatown destination.

The free event embraced the spirit of "togetherness" with cultural activities led by FNA board members and neighbors alike such as mahjong lessons, silk fan painting, inclusive musical storytelling in three languages Mandarin Chinese, ASL, and English, and a live cooking demonstration of jiaozi (dumplings) and which included how to set the table for the "reunion dinner": the first-holiday meal, featuring traditional foods and auspicious dishes imbued with symbolic meaning to promote a good start of the year. The flurry of activities throughout the rooms at the park included a scavenger hunt, which earned you a hong bao or lucky red envelope filled with an educational flyer and chocolate coins, face painting, and Nex Gen Events photo booth.

If all of this made you tired or hungry, the Hana Bistro Food truck was on hand with a delicious array of Asian-inspired menu choices, and Thirsty Dragon Drinks offered an assortment of delicious bubble teas, also available for purchase.

The event, led by the work of FNA Board Members Sophie Su & Carolina Li, welcomed about 200 attendees of all backgrounds, fostering community and celebrating Lunar New Year traditions. Families and neighbors enjoyed the festivities, with many expressing joy at the opportunity to honor their heritage. As the celebration ended, guests departed with lucky red envelopes and mandarins, sharing warm wishes of "Gong Xi Fa Cai" words of blessing and well-wishing that felt just like a classic Minnesota goodbye.

BUCKTHORN WORK GROUP



Fulton Neighborhood Association is starting a Buckthorn Work Group

The Fulton Neighborhood Association Environmental Committee is starting a Buckthorn work group. Buckthorn is an invasive species found around Minnehaha Creek and Lake Harriet. It is an aggressive invasive plant that out competes vegetation and degrades wildlife habitat. Get together with neighbors, enjoy some fresh air, and help get rid of this invasive species!

Join us for our first meeting, **Saturday April 26, 10am-noon**, (rain date Saturday, May 3). We will meet on the west side of Penn Ave S. at the south side of Minnehaha creek by 53rd Street.

A volunteer will show the group how to identify and safely remove Buckthorn. Please bring eye protection and gloves. If you have shovels, pruning saws, and loppers please bring them as well. If you do not, some will be provided for you at this first meeting.
