ulton Neighborhood Association (FNA) is one of more than 70 recognized neighborhood associations in the City of Minneapolis. Some associations are small and represent a few hundred residents; others are larger and represent over 20,000 residents. But whether large or small, neighborhood associations all have this in common: they help develop strong communities.

FNA is an independent non-profit organization governed by an elected volunteer Board of Directors. The Board works to identify common interests in the community, organize and mobilize community resources, and provide feedback to the City on important local issues such as housing, safety and development. By developing a clear vision for the community, and by developing and supporting leadership in the community around that vision, FNA can help the neighborhood grow and thrive in ways that benefit everyone.

Strong neighborhood associations empower their residents by involving them in the decision-making and community-building activities.

Upton Avenue Resurfacing Project

Pre-Public Hearing set for March 27th

Resurfacing of Upton Avenue between 43rd St W and 54th St W (with the exception of the intersections at 50th St W and 52nd St W) is set to begin in Summer 2012.

The resurfacing process consists of removing a portion of the existing asphalt pavement surface and placing a new surface over the entire street. The work typically only takes 2 days in front of anyone's home- one day for pavement removal and a second day for asphalt replacement. The purpose of the resurfacing program is to extend the life of a roadway by approximately 10 years.

There will be an assessment associated with this project.

The City of Minneapolis Public Works Department will hold a Pre-Public Hearing for this project:

Plan Ahead To Divide Your Plants

nce again the Fulton Environment Committee will be coordinating a plant sale to raise funds for additional boulevard trees. As Fulton gardens awake after the long winter and residents begin to clean up their yards, we ask that you keep the plant sale in mind by donating your extra plants or any garden-related items.

Most perennials (plants that come back year after year) can be divided (to separate out a portion) and will actually benefit from previous overcrowding. Early spring is an excellent time to divide plants. The main plant will not notice the disturbance and the small division will have time to acclimate to its pot, thus insuring an attractive plant ready to be sold at our plant sale. Trees must be picked up between May 12-14 at the City of Minneapolis Impound lot. You will forfeit your tree, and the money you paid for it, if you don't pick up your tree on the dates specified. Trees are available on a first-come, first-served basis, and quantities are limited.
