Housing Funds for Community Land Trust Project *Presentation at December FNA Meeting*

There will be a proposal before the Fulton Neighborhood Association (FNA) Board of Directors at its December meeting to allocate a portion of Fulton's Neighborhood Revitalization Program Phase II housing funds to a home ownership collaboration with City of Lakes Community Land Trust (CLCLT) and Minneapolis Public Housing Authority (MPHA).

If the proposal is approved, up to three qualifying low-income families will have an opportunity to purchase a home in Fulton. These homes will be affordable due to grants provided by Fulton, MPHA and the City of Lakes Community Land Trust. Through the participation of the land trust, these homes will remain affordable to future low-income home buyers if and when the original owners sell these homes. FNA Housing Committee members have been working on this initiative for a year to fulfill a portion of Fulton's NRP Phase II Plan requirements. Time to Empty Your Rain Barrel

Your rain barrel needs to be disconnected before winter. Freezing and thawing water may cause your barrel to crack or split. Be sure the barrel and any connecting hoses are completely empty of water and either turn the barrel upside down or cover with a plastic tarp. You should also reconnect a temporary downspout extension to direct water away from your foundation. Flexible extensions are available at most hardware stores.

Friends of Fulton Honored

The eighth annual Friends of Fulton Awards were presented at the Fulton Neighborhood Association Annual Meeting on September 13, 2006. This year, five individuals were recognized for their contributions to Fulton neighborhood. Congratulations and thanks to:

Pat Bogusz served as President of the Fulton Neighborhood Association for two years (2004 and 2005). Pat has also been a member of the NRP Implementation Committee and has helped guide the development and implementation of Fulton's Phase II NRP Plan. This year, Pat hosted the Fabulous Fulton Plant Sale at her home, working with Mary Nolte and volunteers from the Fulton Garden Club. The sale earned over \$800 for FNA.

Bill Kerker has the distinction of being the longest serving FNA Board member. He has been a member of the Board for over a decade. Bill has helped in many capacities, including buckthorn removal and installation of the playground at Lake Harriet Community School Upper Campus. This year Bill provided all the pots for the Fabulous Fulton Plant Sale and picked up the rain barrels for the Rain Barrel Workshop.

Mary Nolte has contributed endless time and energy to the Fulton neighborhood over the past two years. As Chair of the Fulton Environment Committee, Mary has organized several educational workshops, has worked to protect the newly-planted trees in the neighborhood, and promoted the Fulton rainwater management program. Mary worked with Pat Bogusz to organize the successful Fabulous Fulton Plant Sale. She has also been a member of the Community Engagement Committee for the last two years and has helped to plan the Fulton Festival.

Linda Romine has been tireless in her search for grant money to leverage Fulton NRP funds. Last year Linda wrote and was awarded two grants – a Minnesota ReLeaf grant for \$10,000 for neighborhood tree planting and a Minnehaha Creek Watershed District grant for almost \$10,000 for rainwater management. Linda has been a member of the FNA Board for the past two years and has served as FNA Treasurer. She is also a dedicated member of the Fulton Environment Committee.

Lynn Steele attended a brainstorming meeting about Fulton fundraising last spring and came up with the idea of making a quilt as a fundraiser for the Fulton Festival. In a matter of weeks, Lynn made a beautiful stardust pattern quilt and arranged for the neighborhood to participate in marketing the quilt at the Edina Art Fair. The quilt made \$698 for FNA. Last year, Lynn was also a judge for the Fulton Festival Talent Show.

2006 Remodeled Home Tour

On August 13, the first Lake Harriet Remodeled Home Tour took place and it was a great success. The tour was a fundraiser for the neighborhood associations of Fulton, East Harriet Farmstead, Linden Hills, and Lynnhurst. The event provided an opportunity for people to explore our neighborhoods and current remodeling trends. A total of \$900 was raised, which was split evenly between the four associations.

Ben Kolkman, tour organizer, is planning a slightly larger tour next year, and will include more restored old homes and homes more representative of the area. The Center for Energy and Environment, in partnership with the Cities of Minneapolis and St. Paul, have launched a new initiative to encourage citizens to save energy and reduce emissions of carbon dioxide, a greenhouse gas which is the primary contributor to global warming. The goal of the Minnesota Energy Challenge is to empower Minnesotans to take simple steps to reduce their energy use and Minnesota's CO₂ emissions. By visiting the Energy Challenge website (www.mnenergychallenge.org) and providing some brief information about your home's energy use, you can learn about easy steps you can take to save money and energy. And when you pledge to take energy-saving measures, you can assign your savings to the team(s) of your choice, including neighborhood teams, employers, or a team of your friends that you create! See how fast the energy savings add up from just simple actions like replacing incandescent light bulbs with compact fluorescents! As of October 30, Fulton was in second place in the neighborhood rankings (after Linden Hills), with total CO₂ savings of over 53,000 pounds and an average of 23% per participant.
