Dear Fulton Neighbors,

Welcome to Fall! It has been wonderful to see so many of my neighbors out and about at the Lakes, along the Creek, and around town. The first months of my tenure as Council Member for Ward 13 have been hectic and fascinating. There are a number of issues I thought you should be aware of this Fall.

In my role as chair of the Intergovernmental Relations Committee, I spent a great deal of time at the State Capitol during the legislative session. The City had an excellent year at the legislature, particularly in our bonding requests. We secured funding for a number of great projects, including the Shubert Theater, the MacPhail Center for the Arts, and the Cedar Lake Trail, in addition to regional projects like Lake of the Isles and the Lowry Avenue Corridor and Bridge. We also secured an additional \$2 million in funding from the Governor for public safety efforts this summer.

In August, the Public Works Department began the first phase of a four year street renovation project in the Lynnhurst and Fulton neighborhoods. Be aware of this road work as you make your way around the ward. One issue I have talked with neighbors about a great deal in my first six months revolves around neighborhood character, particularly in relation to teardowns and new housing construction. On July 20, my office held a community meeting to discuss the issue. 
The Problem with Buckthorn

And Some Solutions...

Most likely you are aware by now that there is a "buckthorn problem" in Minneapolis. But what exactly is the problem with buckthorn? What can we, as Fulton residents, do about it?

The two species of buckthorn responsible for these problems came to us from Europe, originally to be used in urban land-

scaping as an ornamental tree or hedge. Buckthorn proved to be durable, adaptable, and an aggressive grower. In fact, it grows in just about any soil type. Birds eat the abundant berries that grow on the plant and spread the seeds to our natural wetlands and woodlands. Unfortunately, this non-native plant thrives there as well and is replacing native species, and threatening the diversity of plant species in the areas it invades.



Buckthorn Workshop - October 16, 7 p.m.

So, what can you do to help? The city is asking for residents to help control this invasive species by identifying and removing it from private residences. An informative Buckthorn Workshop will be held on October 16, at 7 p.m., at Pershing Park. Dianne Plunkett Latham, the Buckthorn Abatement Steering Committee Chair for the Edina Garden Council, will conduct the workshop and will offer ways to identify and remove buckthorn on your property, as well as offer suggestions for replacement plants. If you suspect that you have buckthorn on your property, visit the Nature Conservancy website at http://tncweeds.ucdavis.edu/esadocs/franalnu.html to see photos of its fruit and foliage. If you have buckthorn, plan to attend the workshop and encourage your neighbors to attend.

Buckthorn Pickup - November 4, 8 a.m. - 1 p.m.

A special buckthorn pickup date has been scheduled for November 4, 2006. Volunteers from Fulton neighborhood, a wood chipper, and a truck will be going through the neighborhood picking up buckthorn brush. Buckthorn will need to be at your alley or where you normally have trash picked up. Even if you don't have buckthorn on your property, you can still help! Volunteer to help on the day of the pickup or volunteer to help remove it for someone who is physically unable to do it themselves. Preserving our Urban Forest

Keep Watering

Keep watering the newly planted boulevard trees. Trees and shrubs need to be watered until the ground freezes to ensure they make it through the winter.

Better Ballot Campaign

Will Bring Instant Runoff Voting to Minneapolis

This November 7, Minneapolis voters will have a special opportunity when they mark their ballots. An amendment to adopt Instant Runoff Voting (IRV) as the method for electing mayor, city council, and boards for the library, parks, and estimation and taxation will be up for approval. Instant Runoff Voting is a ranked-choice voting method that simulates several rounds of voting, but accomplishes the task in just one election.

The Fulton Neighborhood Association board has endorsed this important ballot measure. Why? Because Instant Runoff Voting is a better voting method that would:

- eliminate the need for primary elections
- increase voter participation and choice of candidates on the ballot
- more accurately represent the voters and foster more positive, issue-based campaigns

The proposal has been endorsed by a broad spectrum of elected officials and candidates, nonprofit organizations, neighborhoods, religious institutions, and political parties.
