Tending the Prairie Garden

The Lake Harriet Community School Upper Campus Prairie Garden has received some much needed attention this fall from a group of concerned parents, neighborhood Master Gardeners, school staff, and volunteers. The ad hoc committee, organized by LHCS parent Madalyn Cioci, has prepared a plan for maintaining the prairie which includes annual weeding days in July and September, periodic aeration and planting of grass seed and additional prairie plants in the Spring of 2005.

A key element of the plan is to encourage the use of the prairie garden as an educational tool. In that spirit, three weeding sessions were led by Master Gardeners Mary Zeleny Arimond and Diane Jensen in October with grade 6/7 science classes taught by Deb Bahl Moore. Another educational component for next spring is the development of laminated information cards about prairie plants, designed for student use.
