From the State Deficit to the City Budget

As we learned in our first After the Election seminar titled *Follow the Money*, city officials have been working for the past year to restore financial health to Minneapolis in the face of a serious city budget deficit. Now an unexpectedly large state deficit may create further fiscal challenges for the city. *Council Members Barret Lane and Scott Benson* will lead a panel of Southwest state legislators, including *Senators Scott Dibble and Jane Ranum, and State Representatives Frank Hornstein and Paul Thissen*, through a discussion about how the state deficit will affect Minneapolis.

"Focus Minneapolis" Approved

Development Reform to Begin in 2003

The Minneapolis City Council approved Focus Minneapolis - a major initiative aimed at making the City's planning and community development functions more effective, responsive and accountable. The Council approved the resolution on an 11-2 vote on September 13th, 2002.

Focus Minneapolis will guide the City through the following actions:

- ♦ Create an Office of Community Planning and Economic Development (CPED) to oversee, coordinate and streamline all City planning and development activity; and incorporate the functions of the Minneapolis Community Development Agency into the department.
- ♦ Create a Development Services Department to make it easier for residents, businesses and developers to do business with the city. The city will evaluate which functions of the current Regulatory Services department to include in this new department by Jan. 1, 2003.
- ♦ Establish housing and economic development as the City's top development priorities; and commit the City to setting specific, measurable goals during its strategic planning process this fall.
- ♦ Strengthen management and decision-making processes to improve strategic planning and focus development activity on these development priorities.
- ♦ Evaluate incorporation of functions of the Neighborhood Revitalization Program (NRP), Regulatory Services and the Department of Health and Family Support into the CPED organizational structure.

The City has begun this process by appointing Lee Sheehy as Minneapolis's Interim Community Planning and Economic Development Director to serve jointly as Executive Director of the Minneapolis Community Development Agency. Sheehy currently serves as the Metropolitan Council's regional administrator and chief operating officer. He directs the council's planning, transit and sewer functions and oversees an annual operating budget of \$550 million, an equivalent capital budget and about 3,800 employees.

An evaluation process commenced on January 1, 2003 when the City Coordinator and Interim CPED Director began working with the affected agencies and departments to prepare for Council consideration, recommendations regarding whether to incorporate functions of the NRP, Regulatory Services and the Department of Health and Family Support into the CPED organizational structure, as well as recommendations regarding long-term position of the CPED Office within the City's larger organizational structure. What's Happening in Minneapolis that Fulton Neighbors Need to Know?

Minneapolis Ski Event Planned

The first ever *City of Lakes Loppet* (Loppet is Swedish for ski race), a 35k cross-country ski race, will wind through Minneapolis parks this winter. This celebration of winter and cross-country skiing will happen on January 31 and February 1. The race begins at the newly planned cross country ski trails in Theodore Wirth Park, takes skiers through beautiful and unusually remote areas of Minneapolis parks and trails and eventually ends at the channel between from Lake of the Isles and Lake Calhoun. No other city in America could create such a scenic and diverse course. If all goes well - and the snowfall cooperates - the City of Lakes Loppet could become a national event.

Activities will include the main 35k event and a Minne-Loppet 10k family ski on Lake Calhoun. Another unique feature planned is "Loppet's Best Neighborhood" - a competition of the 11 neighborhood associations along the course for the best on-course distractions for the skiers. Mayor R.T. Rybak envisioned the Loppet after skiing in an event last winter and it has been organized through private sponsors partnering with the Mayor's office and the Minneapolis Park Board. Council Member's Report

Did you know . . .

- ♦ That for the second straight year, a Brown University study rated the City of Minneapolis website to be the **best e-government site** among the nation's 70 largest metropolitan areas? Stop by for a visit at www.ci.minneapolis.mn.us. To visit the Ward 13 page, click on the "Elected Officials" link on the City's homepage. There is extensive information about the ward's neighborhoods and issues as well as articles and links to help you learn more about your community and city.
- ◆That five Ward 13 neighborhoods are the **5 safest neighborhoods** in Minneapolis? In 2000, each neighborhood's crime rate (crimes per 1000 in population) was calculated. Linden Hills and Fulton tied for 75th, Lynnhurst ranked 77th, Armatage 78th, and Kenny 79th. In the 5th precinct (which serves the 13th Ward), in 2001 crime declined below 2000 numbers. So far this year crime has continued to decline.
- ◆ Residents cannot leave **unattached trailers** on the street? If not attached to a car or truck it will be ticketed. Why? Unattached trailers can damage streets, harm people, and are attractive to vandals and thieves. Please attach your trailers and/or store them in your driveway or garage.
- ♦ That your CCP/SAFE team will provide a **free home security check**? They also hold crime prevention seminars for homeowners and businesses. To learn more call Off.
